Asian animals also make an appearance. No matter which country we are in, Mischievous Monkey will pop up to tell us "I've got relatives who live here". Elephant elaborates on life in India and Thailand and how she differs from her African cousins, while shy Panda and Orangutan tell how their small families need lots of friends, if they are to survive. This awesome foursome are joined by other more traditional puppets and masks from an Asia past.

With older audiences, wealth is discussed in terms that students understand. Will you pay a few, hundreds, thousands or ten's of thousand of the local currency for a burger and whether or not most children live in houses that have flush toilets, televisions and computers.
