# Make your own Hermit Crab

The hermit crab puppets used in the performance 'A Fish Story' are easy to make. Follow these simple instructions to make your own!

## Things you will need:



- 1) A large tin, ice cream container, or half a milk carton for small hands.
- 2) A cotton glove that goes past your wrist.
- 3) Some textas, dye, and maybe some teddy bear eyes.
- 4) Hot glue and glue gun, or some high quality cloth tape.
- 5) A length of felt or other thick soft fabric.




### STEP ONE:

Use scissors or tin snips to cut a hole in the tin or container as close to the opening or top as you can, don't leave any sharp corners that could scratch you.

### STEP TWO:

Cut a strip of felt that is wide enough to wrap round both edges of the hole, and long enough to cover all the edge. Glue or tape this over the edge of the hole you have cut out.




### STEP THREE:

Feed the glove through the opening of your tin or container, pull the wrist end of the glove through the hole you have cut, snip the edges of the glove so that it can be glued or taped around the hole securely. The fingers of the glove should hang out the opening of the tin or container.

### STEP FOUR:

Your Hermit Crab Puppet is almost ready. Glue, sew, or draw some eyes on the front of the glove near your knuckles. You can also paint, dye or decorate your glove but do this before you attach it to the tin or container.




